In 2000 he was selected by Howard Wilkinson and won three caps for the England under-21s. He retired at the end of the 2012-2013 season after making over 500 appearances at senior level. Clarke has experienced the very highs of professional sport and was a successful chairman of the PFA (Professional Footballers' Association).
